

Nest Predation by Predator Species



Chick Predation by Predator Species





11 Year Pair, Fledgling Totals




CAHA Breeding Pair Dynamics

- Even though there have been 23 pairs since 2006, the pair compositions have not remained static. (Gr) 12 has had 3 mates in as many years, after the previous two were depredated or did not return.
- Since 2007 at least 7 breeding birds have shown up and then disappeared [e.g. (Gr) 23 lost to owl], or have failed to show up at all.
- In 2009 three pair with breeding histories arrived, but did not nest. (Sound-side?) All the birds were re-sighted later in the year.

Continued

In 2009, two birds on active nests were lost to predation. An unbanded bird on Bodie Spit was lost to a peregrine falcon and (Gr) 88, at Hatteras Inlet, was lost to unknown causes. The later bird's mate, (Gr) 02 stayed at or near the nest and paired with an unbanded bird and a 4th egg was laid in the nest, 22 days after the third egg was laid. None of the prior three eggs hatched "on time" and all four were lost to mink predation by day 44. The former bird's mate, also unbanded, abandoned the nest.
