


Sandy Point Island









2011 Rhode Island Nesting Summary


- 27 nesting pairs

- 0.81 productivity

- 30 nesting pairs
- 32 nests
- 21 chicks fledged
- 0.72 productivity



Next Steps

- Continue efforts in 2012
- Received additional grant funding
- Start surveys earlier and protect nests sooner
- Increase monitoring
- Increase public awareness of nesting birds and of sitespecific regulations on dogs
- Get more volunteers engaged
- Possibly control predators
- Start banding in Rhode Island
- Work with New York
