


## Atlantic Flyway Shorebirds

- Approximately 70% of Arctic-nesting shorebirds have been declining (R.I.G. Morrison).
- Semipalmated Sandpiper & Ruddy Turnstone down by as much as 80% on Delaware Bay (L. Niles et al.).
- Semipalmated Sandpiper, Ruddy Turnstone, and yellowlegs down by as much as 90% in northern South America (D. Mizrahi et al.).
- Whimbrel, Short-billed Dowitcher, Dunlin, & Sanderling substantial declines (R.I.G. Morrison).

#### Focal Species

1. highly imperiled or of high concern;

3. have existing conservation plans to make implementation more practical.
