- Put out 6 9.5 g solar PTTs (platform transmitter terminals) on adult AMOY in NC
- Follow them for a year and record patterns of habitat use
- Create website to engage more people in AMOY

- Very visual

- Encourage interest in oysteratchers



- Five free birds, two migrations tracked
- Habitat use (greatest distance traveled)
 - Breeding: 1 4 miles
 - Post-breeding: 3.5 10 miles
 - Winter: 2/14 and 4/25 miles
- Improved leg loop technique
- Potential to use open-source GPS transmitters in future



- Since May, 2,174 unique visitors to website, 3,343 total visits
 - A third of visits are re-visits
- Media interest
 - About 10 articles online and in print
- A platform for communicating about other tracked AMOY
