






About Us

Central and South Texas

Goal: Conserve coastal birds & habitats

Actions:

- Waterbird Management
 - Manage and monitor over 100 nesting islands
- Shorebird Monitoring
 - Manage and monitor 16,000 acres



WHERE WE WORK

CBBEP's program area includes 75 miles of estuaries and adjacent watersheds along the south-central coastline of Texas. This area, known as the Coastal Bend, encompasses 12 counties, 11,500 square miles of land, 515 square miles of bays, estuaries, and lagoons, and over 570,000 residents.

The blue dots on the map represent locations where CBBEP implemented projects in 2020.

12 COUNTIES

3 BAY SYSTEMS

515 SQUARE MILES OF WATER

CBBEP has expanded our bird conservation efforts into the Lower Laguna Madre using grant funds.

AMOY in Central and South Texas

- Monitored & banded only opportunistically while completing other program tasks
- Birds territorial and come into traps as early as January
- Nesting starts as early as February
